2. Location: 2920 10th St. Name: Inhabitants of the Wetlands **Business Sponsor: Best Western Angus Inn Artist: Sally Rychlec**

The Best Western Angus Inn has a grouping of three birdhouses that represent various creatures that inhabit the Wetland area; a Whooping Crane, a duck, dragonflies, butterflies, and a turtle. The Whooping Crane is an endangered species and the ability to see these birds up close speaks volumes of the value of the Wetlands. Not only does this provide our community and visitors great pleasure today, but we are saving these animals for generations to come.

Migrate all around Great Bend on this tour of artist-decorated birdhouses. Over 50 birdhouses, ranging in size from 3 to 5 feet tall perch proudly in front of businesses all over town in honor of the thousands of birds who are drawn here every year by the wetlands of Cheyenne Bottoms. This tour will guide you with colorful descriptions written by the artists themselves.

3. Location: 620 Morton Name: Fun & Recreation **Business Sponsor: McDonald Tank Artist: Lance Walters**

Housed under real roof shingles, this birdhouse features a collage of fun outdoor recreation such as camping, boating, 4wheeling, and fishing, that one can enjoy in our area. When enjoying one of these fun activities, be sure to watch for the wildlife and native plants along the Wetlands & Wildlife National Scenic Byway.

4. Location: 1005 Williams St. Name: Natural Healing **Business Sponsor: Warren Brothers** Artist: Sr. Rebecca Otter

Heartland Center is a place of healing and wholeness. These attributes are portrayed in a natural setting, which include birds, butterflies, and flowers to truly portray the nature and wildlife qualities that engulf the area.

5. Location: 1125 Williams Name: Vision of the Peacock **Business Sponsor: Great Bend Chamber of Commerce & Economic Development Artist: Kelsey Couture**

The birdhouse is decorated with peacock feathers, which symbolizes the organization's role in the community.

In ancient Greece, the myth of the goddess Hera says that she placed the "eyes" on the peacock feathers symbolizing the wisdom of heavens. Other myths suggest that the peacock, who can eat poisonous plants with no ill effects, symbolizes the ability to thrive in the face of suffering.

The Great Bend Chamber of Commerce chose this beautiful feather to represent its long-term vision for the community, while reflecting on its ability to thrive through the ups and downs in the economy due to its strengths in the oil and agriculture industries. In addition, the beautiful nature of the feather reflects all of the natural beauty Great Bend boasts in its city parks, Chevenne Bottoms, and the gorgeous Kansas sunsets.

A beautiful Kansas setting-sun, a curious crane, and a cattail plant perfectly depict Office Products Incorporated's acronym, OPI, on one side of the birdhouse. On another side, a wetlands creature adorns a file cabinet. Look around the corner again and you will see birds and miscellaneous office products sitting upon a shelf.

This birdhouse depicts a natural Kansas scene that includes a field of our state flower, the Sunflower. It also portrays the Kansas farming culture with a post rock corner post and a golden wheat field. Another scene represented on the birdhouse is the Chevenne Bottoms area with a few water fowl lingering around the marshy waters. The top of the birdhouse is accented with an American Flag to express our patriotism and support for our country.

The unique and colorful features of this purple (Go K-State) birdhouse are comprised of a metal powder coated superstructure (to withstand the Kansas wind) along with 100+ year old antique tin type ceiling tile that was salvaged from inside the Treaders building when it was remodeled by the MyTown project in 2010.

The rough and tough settlers in the past used the available resources from around their surroundings to build their homes, and this birdhouse represents that hard work and effort that each family endured to create their homes and land to farm.

C. Across the prairie you will get a glimpse of what life and nature was like before the industrial settlement of man. With migrating bison, free roaming cattle, and their companions, the egrets. These animals were abundant during the time of the native settlements.


A. Designing divas, such as Starlings,

results of his project management skills.

Canadian Goose perches atop her birdhouse.
Other birds featured across this birdhouse are
Sandhill Cranes standing along the shoreline of a

marsh, while waterfowl swim nearby. Just like out at the Bottoms, the Sunflowers depicted provide great perching posts for Black Birds, Swallows, Blue Jays, Orange Crowned Warblers, Wrens, and Sparrows.

This setting depicts the waters of Chevenne Bottoms with elegantly young reeds placed in rows, layering the Kansas sky. Within the landscape are three curious cows and white egrets representing nature's delicate balance of symbiotic relationships, their existence being a lesson for the human heart. The cows become a pedestal for the egrets within nature. The traditional weather vane graces the bird house- a directional reminder of the migratory bird pathway.

A. Look into the windows of our birdhouse and become captivated by ceramic masks that have been derived directly from the faces of Barton County domestic and sexual violence survivors. This birdhouse combines both cast iron and ceramic elements sure to make this a must see!

B. The Family Crisis Center's Child Survivors of Domestic and Sexual Violence support group collaborated with artist Renee Miller to complete this colorful birdhouse.

20. Location: 1515 Main Name: Imaginative Designs **Business Sponsor: Kustom Floor Designs**

This birdhouse displays actual materials used in real life interior and exterior settings in and around the home. The birdhouse creates a visual of the available design possibilities for the viewer's imagination to awaken and become inspired.

A traditional white chapel with stained glass windows, steeple, and a bell provide the perfect setting for a fairytale wedding. The viewer will also enjoy a few interactive surprises as well.

This birdhouse was inspired by the therapeutic riding program at the Rosewood Ranch and custom horsehair pottery created by Rosewood artists with developmental disabilities. They carefully select the hair from a trusted therapy horse and by creatively placing this hair on the pottery as it leaves the hot kiln; it creates the amazing carbon designs. Mosaic pieces of this pottery, combined with other western design pieces, captures the heart and soul of life at the Ranch. Rosewood believes that all people with disabilities have the same opportunities as everyone else. These opportunities range from becoming skilled equestrians to talented ceramic artists.

23. Location: 1612 Main St. Name: Our Roots Run Deep **Business Sponsor: Farmer's Bank & Trust**

Inspired by native Cheyenne Wetlands, one of the features of this birdhouse is the cottonwood tree with its deep root system. "Our Roots Run Deep" signifies the bank's commitment to the central Kansas communities it serves with local ownership and the deep investment in the families in this area.

Cattails, reed grasses, and marsh foliage thrive abundantly in this central prairie area, represented in metal composition and hand painted designs. Silhouettes of sandhill cranes and whooping cranes are featured as they stop for refuge in this wetland area on their journey along the Central Flyway. Sandhill cranes generally stop over during the spring & fall migrations. Whooping cranes, an endangered species, migrate through Cheyenne Bottoms, the largest marsh in the interior of the United States. As the sun sets, the migrating birds stop to prepare for their continued journey.

24. Location: 2123 Main St. Name: It's in our Nature to be Wild! **Business Sponsor: Nex-Tech Wireless & Zoo**

A. This colorful birdhouse gives the viewer a preview of what they will see when they enter into the Raptor Center. The Raptor Center was created to further preserve and save the wildlife that visits the two inland marshes that anchor the Wetlands & Wildlife National Scenic Byway. Inside you will find magnificent educational displays to learn the importance that raptors and migratory birds hold in our area.

B. As you view this birdhouse listen closely to the sound of the animals from inside the Great Bend Brit Spaugh Zoo. You may even get lost in the artwork and start to imagine that you are in a jungle miles away from here in the Amazon Rainforest or the African Tundra.

25. Location: 1409 Williams Name: Painted Lady Business Sponsor: Dee Holman **Artist: Jill Fitzsimmons**

Characters from a favorite children's book, "The Napping House" comes to life as a multigeneration family that indulges in home life activities in a "Painted Lady" Victorian house. A loving grandmother keeps a watchful eye on the front porch as a young boy plays with his furry friends. Just like the library in which the birdhouse is located, this birdhouse has something for everyone!

26. Location: 3515 Broadway Name: Stewards of Christ **Business Sponsor: The Mingenback Family Artist: Leslie Mingenback**

The St. Rose Birdhouse features key points that remind us of our name sake, St. Rose of Lima, noted for helping the sick & hungry. The heritage the Dominican Sisters of Peace and the core values of Catholic Health Initiatives (CHI), reverence, integrity, compassion & excellence are prominently featured to help us remember how we can deliver the best possible healthcare to our patients. The pinnacle of the birdhouse features a metallic cross that reminds us to be outstanding stewards of Christ's healing ministry to all people. Wonderful Kansas sunflowers, blue Kansas sky and billowy clouds give this birdhouse a welcome and refreshing feeling of helping our patients get well to resume their exciting and fulfilling lives.

27. Location: 3600 Broadway Name: Be Peace! Build Peace! Preach Peace! **Business Sponsor: Straub International Artist: Sister Rebecca Otter OP**

A. The theme of the Dominican Sisters in Great Bend within the history of the worldwide Dominican Family is projected through this birdhouse. It is in the traditional black and white colors of the Dominican Family. Symbols of the Dominican Family during the 13th century include the burning torch (the preaching mission of the Dominicans) and the black dog with a torch in his mouth (Saint Dominic and Dominicans taking the message of Jesus all around the world.) More

current symbols are the dove, olive branch, and logo of the newly-formed Dominican Sisters of Peace in Kansas is one of the seven founding members, "Be Peace! Build Peace! Preach Peace!"

B. The theme of this Dominican Sisters of Peace birdhouse depicts the praise of God arising from all of creation with its theme from Psalm 66:1 "Sing with joy to God all the Earth!" Music and inspirational quotes weave through the ways creation praises God: bird song, the beautiful color and diversity of flora and fauna, and the dominant blue and green of our home planet Earth. The Western Meadowlark, sunflowers, and wheat focus the Kansas experience of creation in Mid-America, one of the regional homes of the Dominican Sisters of Peace.

28. Location: 4200 Broadway Name: The School House **Business Sponsor: Straub International Artist: Hillary King & Holy Family Students** Our school's birdhouse will be a colorful representation of our school house, present day, and of school houses in the past. Our theme revolves around Catholic Schools and all that is part of that history. Painting of the birdhouse provided an educational opportunity for the students under the direction of a parent volunteer to learn more about "school" history.

29. Location: 1649 Hwy K-96 Name: Birds At Home **Business Sponsor: Waters True Value** Artist: Scott Beahm

This birdhouse depicts birds of Kansas engaged in home-improvement tasks throughout the four seasons. Different departments of the store (paint, hardware, lawn and garden, rental equipment, etc.) are depicted with birds of the Barton County Area using the tools to accomplish their building goals. In the design, the birds offer an interesting perspective on the ways humans create their homes.

A tall, slender Crane basks in the sunshine of a beautiful pink glowing sunset. There are 2 types of cranes common to our area, the Sandhill and the Whooping. Whooping Cranes are a rare sight to see and the wetlands in our area are one of the few locations where one can get an up close glimpse of the endangered bird.

Located among the Westgate Shopping Center, this birdhouse features birds painted in the folkart style scattered among the leaves of majestic

trees that can be found around the area. Atop the

At first glance you may believe this birdhouse is an actual gun safe. Covered in a beautiful black cherry color, it is a fine example of the various types of safes that you can purchase in the store. A magnificent Sycamore Tree with detailed branches and leaves has been stenciled in to tie in the Wetlands & Wildlife National Scenic Byway. To finish off this fine masterpiece, the artist added metal spindles for the handles crafted in scrolling detail.

The tree of life is reflected by the Inn which was long been an inspiration to the community. "It's in our nature to inspire!"
