

WPA Mural - Post Office

This oil on canvas full mural (12 ft. x 5 ft.) is titled "Wheat Center" and depicts a large harvest threshing scene. The mural was designed and painted in 1938. The lobby also displays three scenes by a local artist, Bob Booth, depicting the modernization of harvest. The WPA mural was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1989.

Other Art B

WPA Sundial - City Building

The WPA was the largest New Deal agency created under President Roosevelt in 1935, employing millions to carry out public works projects including the construction of public buildings. The Hoisington city building was built in 1939 as a WPA project. At the top of the Hoisington City Building column is a sundial that keeps perfect time!
